COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR John Helge

In honor of the new year, the Manistee County Democratic Party would like to share some of our resolutions for 2024. Here's to health, wealth, hope, and happiness for us all!

- 1. Our monthly columns will not be history lessons. We will make every effort to focus on the future and what this county, state, and country needs from those we choose to represent us in the challenging work of governing. We must learn from past mistakes but also be willing to take bold, progressive action to move Michigan forward and meet the needs and expectations of all people, not just those who fund campaigns and expect special treatment in return.
- 2. The Manistee County Democratic Party will ask all our members to be more engaged in the political process in 2024. The number of people who have made a personal commitment to join this local community organization has grown steadily as more folks in Manistee County are proud to be "out loud" Democrats who work for social, economic, and environmental justice for all. The 2024 election cycle will require all hands-on deck to overcome the misinformation, chaos, and fear being

- spread by the hard-right media ecosystem and social media propagandists.
- 3. We will actively listen to and empathize with any resident of Manistee County who feels they are not being heard by their elected representatives at all levels. We may not have a quick fix for any specific issue, but we are committed to hearing you and will try to help you find a solution.
- 4. We will help make it easier for you to vote in 2024. Everyone can now vote using an absentee ballot. All you must do is request an absentee ballot application from your City or Township Clerk. You will also be able to "skip the line" by heading to your Clerk's office and taking advantage of in-person early voting, which begins approximately two weeks before election day and this applies to the February and August primaries, as well as the general election in November.
- 5. We want you to vote for the local or regional candidate that you feel will best represent you, your family, and your neighbors, so please take the time to become an informed voter. Challenge yourself to read up on all candidates to determine if they are worthy of your vote. (The nonpartisan League of Women Voters collects and distributes candidate information to the public before each election.) The Manistee County Democratic Party will also expect all candidates from any political party affiliation to actively participate in town hall candidate forums and debates prior to the election.
- 6. We continue to advocate for changing the current antiquated, unfair Electoral College system of selecting the President and Vice President of the United States to a system in which the candidate with the most votes wins. The cold, hard fact is that third-party candidates have zero chance of winning a presidential election under the current system. If you're hoping a third-party vote is a good way to protest the lack of a presidential candidate that speaks to your issues, it sadly is NOT. With that in mind and knowing 2024 is an election year that is critical to the future of this country, we urge you to avoid wasting your vote on a third-party candidate who is already doomed to lose.
- 7. We will challenge you to vote in the November election, even if you think voting doesn't matter and nothing ever changes. Elections can have

dire consequences (the elimination of reproductive rights granted under *Roe v. Wade* comes to mind), so things do, in fact, change. It's also not hyperbole to say there's a leading 2024 presidential candidate who believes they have the power to prevent any future free and fair elections. Your decision to sit out the 2024 election may help put unqualified fringe candidates in office who are not willing to do the hard work of governing for the greater good of all their constituents.

- 8. The Manistee County Democratic Party will hold monthly informational meetings that are open to the public. These meetings will feature speakers who have specific, factual information to share on issues that are important to people living in Manistee County. Our goal is to reduce the amount of misinformation and rumors that are spread when difficult issues arise.
- 9. And finally, the Manistee County Democratic Party leadership is committed to listening to the concerns, needs, issues, or new ideas of all residents. We welcome your active engagement in the political process and value your opinions on how we can do a better job connecting with voters in Manistee County. 2024 Strategic Planning Meeting Recap

24 engaged MCDP members gathered at the WSCC building for the 2024 Strategic Planning Meeting. It was a great turnout considering the wintery weather! We held spirited, and had positive discussions focused on developing the strategy for the MCDP in 2024. We reached mutual agreements on strategic goals and received good feedback on the tactics necessary to successfully achieve these goals. Key input was a strong desire to provide more training for members to enable them to be better prepared and more confident in engaging in civil conversations with prospective voters in Manistee County.

The quarterly goals listed below outline the tactical actions we will undertake to comply with the \$500 quarterly grant from Contest Every Race. The quarterly actions all align very well with the strategic goals we have agreed to at the meeting.

Quarter 1 Goals: Define our path forward, find 3 commissioner candidates and 16 township trustee candidates, fully staff the 2024 campaign office to enable it to be open 7 days/week while in operation.

Quarter 2 Goals: Register at least 200 new voters in Manistee County, conduct 2 "Dining with the Dems" and "Weekly Coffee and Conversation" events, Get at least one LTE per week.

Quarter 3 Goals: Have conversations with at least 100 Manistee County voters who identify as strong Dems who are not currently engaged with the MCDP, hold pop-up offices throughout Manistee County once per week from August through election day, get 100% of all strong and leaning dems in Manistee county to request AV ballots.

Quarter 4 Goals: Get 100% of strong and leaning Dem AV ballots returned, Document voter performance in Manistee County to the precinct level, continue to work with the Feeding America Food Truck every month.



Consider Running for Local Office

If you haven't before, take a moment to consider running for an elected office. Manistee County needs more citizens involved in local government. We also need younger, more diverse voices to serve on township and county boards. Everyone over 18 years old and a resident of their county and township is eligible.

Did you know that 75% of partisan races in the United States go uncontested? In Manistee County, out of the 80 partisan positions up for grabs, only 24 are currently held by Democrats.

"Contest Every Race", a pro-Democratic organization, wants to change that statistic for rural counties in Michigan. The Manistee County Democratic Party is working with "Contest Every Race" to obtain training and funding to support our efforts in recruiting enough candidates to put a D on the ballot across from every R.

It has been shown that having local Democratic **candidates on the ballot increases voter turnout** and holds the Republican incumbent accountable. And there are so many more advantages...like getting your message out, making a difference in your community and serving your constituents.

Last week at a meeting in Kaleva John Makinen, an 87-year-old resident and strong Democrat, stepped up to run for Trustee on the Maple Grove Township Board. His friends Ken and Ellen Kuuttila told me that John is very active in his community. I hope this story inspires you. Whether you want to be a name on a ballot or run a full campaign, we need your engagement and will support your candidacy.

To that end, we are holding **Candidate Interest meetings** to meet with anyone wanting to explore a possible run for **Township or County elected offices**. Find out what positions are available, what duties these positions entail, how to file and how the party can support you.

- 5. Return to the *Member Sign-in* Screen and enter the password.


You are now a signed in member of the MCDP and can explore the options that are available. Remember to note your password and save it in a secure location.
