
MONTHLY INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS



SPARK IN THE DARK

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE

Local nonprofit *Spark in the Dark* is redefining the impact that social media can have on a community by connecting people in need directly with thousands of Northern Michiganders who can provide warm and generous support. Unlike other aid organizations, Spark doesn't have an office. They don't have a large staff. They don't run a food pantry or a resale store. So how have they helped more than 12,000 community members every year, since 2017?

Spark uses the power and accessibility of free social media tools. Facebook to be exact. They create and manage free online membership groups on the popular social media platform. Members either post urgent needs they may have—an unexpected need for baby formula or emergency vehicle repairs for example—or they post items which they would like to donate to families in need.

Spark's members help when they can with what they have regardless of their situation. This creates a deep and lasting positive impact on members self-worth and sense of community. Ultimately it also empowers individuals and the entire group to thrive and support each other through good times and bad with confidence and kindness.

Spark member Kerry recently posted: “This group is just a blessing in disguise. The amount of people who are more than willing to help is just so admirable.”

“I'm originally from Central Pennsylvania and you would NEVER see people help like this,” Kerry continued. “It warms my heart that this group exists.”

Spark member and mother Melissa posted: “This group means a lot to me. I moved to Traverse City almost four years ago after my divorce. Starting over was not easy without the help of this amazing community of folks. Spark folks helped me to furnish my first apartment for me and my kids.

“This group now gives me a platform to give back to my community,” Melissa concluded. “Thank you everyone!”

Another grateful Spark community member, Tara, also recently posted: “What I love most is that there is a place for everyone here. I personally love to contribute and help. In fact, I seek the opportunity most days and I am so grateful to have a local site like this!

Spark is working to change the nonprofit sector by using technology and social media to turn online conversations into offline communities. Spark never turns away those with unusual or difficult needs. They walk alongside our members, connecting them to a local community with the resources to help solve their challenges.

At a time when so many people are struggling to meet their basic needs, a group like Spark can be transformative.

However even a small and lean organization like Spark still needs the generous support of their broader community to sustain and grow their work. Having proven their model works, Spark also hopes to expand and create new groups across Northern Michigan over the next several years.

DISTRICT HEALTH DEPARTMENT #10 ADDS WAITLIST REGISTRATION LINKS TO WEBSITE FOR PHAE 1A AND 1B

District Health Department #10 (DHD#10) added two additional Waitlist Registration Links to their website for those healthcare workers in Phase 1A who have not been vaccinated and for individuals in Phase 1B, except for PreK-12 school staff, to complete. DHD#10 is working directly with school administrators to coordinate vaccine clinics for their staff, so we ask that school staff not register on the waitlist.

Currently, there are three Waitlist Registration Links on the website:

1. Seniors 65+
2. Phase 1A Healthcare Workers
3. Phase 1B Priority Frontline Workers (except Schools)

Please go to <https://www.dhd10.org/covid-19-vaccine/> to review the information. It is important that individuals read all instructions and information posted on the website first before completing the form to get on the waitlist. If you do not have access to technology, consider reaching out to friends or family members to ask for assistance. The fastest way to get on the waiting list is to complete the online registration.

For those seniors 65 and older who do not have access to technology and do not have others to assist you, there is a hotline number to call: 231-715-5557. Someone will complete your forms with you over the phone to get on the waiting list. Once you are on the waiting list, you will be contacted when the vaccine is available so you can be scheduled to receive it. Please know this phone number is experiencing extremely high call volumes. Keep trying if you are having trouble getting through.
